

"Molotov" is a piece of art that burns in the soul of the viewer. This artwork is a visual representation of tension, protest, and rebellion.

It exudes a powerful rebellious energy, embodied in its palette of vibrant colors and bold use of shapes and sharp lines. Dark hues contrast with brighter marks, reminiscent of fire and passion, dominating the composition and evoking a sense of urgency and turmoil.

Its form is not defined but rather evokes the controlled chaos of a demonstration, suggesting an idea of constant movement, as if the artwork is in constant expansion.

Through its dynamic structure and visceral intensity, "Molotov" transforms into a visual ode to the strength of rebellion. It is a call to action, an invitation to explore the depths of one's own outrage and to channel it into positive change.

Overall, "Molotov" is an artwork that cannot go unnoticed. It is a silent yet powerful cry of protest that creeps into the soul of the viewer, inviting reflection on the injustices of the world and finding the strength to fight against them.

Così nel 2008 partecipa alla mostra d'arte presso lo spazio aperto della Fondazione Versiliana a Marina di Pietrasanta. Nel 2009 apre e gestisce un work shop con Galleria in Via Ostilia 3b dove espone le sue opere in modo permanente e continuativo.

Dal 2012 al 2013 espone presso la Galleria Uno di Daniel Capitanu.

Successivamente l'artista si classifica tra i primi dodici finalisti del Primo Concorso Internazionale di Exibart Arte e Laguna. In questi anni di grandi sperimentazioni pittoriche Annalisa Tescari Appuhn decide di svolgere l'apprendistato come restauratrice di dipinti presso la Bottega dell'Arco di Andrea Carfagna.

Dal 2017 l'artista decide di riprendere e approfondire l'attività scultorea creando opere di straordinario impatto visivo.

Dal 27 al 29 agosto del 2021 partecipa con la galleria - Van Gogh Art Gallery all'International Contemporary Art Fair – art3f di Monaco

Dal 1 al 15 aprile 2022 espone nell'ambito della mostra "COME WITH ME" – Esposizione internazionale d'arte contemporanea a cura di Divulgarti presso Palazzo Ducale di Genova.

The artist Annalisa Tescari Appuhn was born in Legnago (VR).

While establishing her extensive artistic language she decided to move to Rome where she currently lives and works.

She began exhibiting her works in 2007 at the Galleria Rilievi in Rome where her already well defined artistic language continued to evolve through a process of constant experimentation. So ....

In 2008 she participated in the art exhibition at the open space of the Versiliana Foundation in Marina di Pietrasanta

In 2009 Annalisa opened and managed a work shop and permanent gallery in Via Ostilia 3b where she exhibited her works continuously. From 2012 to 2013 she exhibited at Daniel Capitanu's Galleria Uno.

Subsequently, Annalisa was ranked amongst the top twelve finalists of the First International Competition of Exibart Arte e Laguna. In these years of great pictorial experiments, Annalisa decided to carry out an apprenticeship as a restorer of antique paintings at Andrea Carfagna's Bottega dell'Arco. Since 2017 the artist decided to return to and deepen her activity as sculptor, creating numerous work of extraordinary visual impact. From 27 to 29 August 2021 she collaborated with the Gallery - Van Gogh Art Gallery at the International Contemporary Art Fair in Munich

From 1 to 15 April 2022 she exhibited as part of the exhibition "COME WITH ME" – International contemporary art exhibition curated by Divulgarti at Palazzo Ducale in Genoa.

In the same year she exhibited her works digitally at Tana Art Space Gallery during the Venice Biennale From 28 November to 4 December 2022 she exhibited her works digitally as part of the exhibition "Adrenocromo for dinner", curated by MADS GALLERY Milan and Fuerteventura She exhibits some works at Art Basel Miami 3.0 curated by Artbox Projects.

A succession of hands, one after the other, each with its own soul. Hands that work and shape the material, hands that express and communicate loudly. "Hands" is the result of the sensitivity and creative strength of the sculptor artist Annalisa Tescari Appuhn. Each of these loudly expresses its own identity, an intimate story of life, a state of mind on which to dwell and reflect. These works evoke the strength and energy of the material which, once worked and shaped by the artist, reveals its essence. An invitation perhaps to think, to the depth of feelings or perhaps to safeguard relationships. An underlying thread flows and unites these hands upwards, a succession of emotions and profound delicacy. An intense, but at the same time delicate style creates a one-of-a-kind sculpture. Each hand is oriented differently, transferring a sense of inclusion and welcome, guidance and active involvement to the observer. Sono nato a Pistoia il 10 dicembre del 1973  
Sono sposato con Gianna dal 2002 e sono padre dal  
2003 di una figlia di nome Bianca  
Vivo in una località presso Pistoia che si chiama  
CIREGLIO, paese in una zona che rimane tra  
Abetone e Pistoia e quindi dove inizia a farsi "viva"  
la montagna  
Amo infatti ritirarmi lontano dalla città senza  
naturalmente scapparne  
Il mio percorso scolastico si è concluso nel 1999 con  
la laurea in LETTERE E FILOSOFIA presso l'Università  
di FIRENZE

Ciò che mi ha da sempre contraddistinto è però una profonda e intima passione nei confronti dell'Arte  
Oltre a dipingere sono anche infatti bassista dall'età di 16 anni e suono attualmente in due gruppi

La pittura la ritengo però come il mio personale mezzo di espressione più intimo attraverso la quale riesco esclusivamente e veramente ad esprimere quelle che sono le mie controversie e angosce più intime e anche nascoste.

La ritengo parte di me e cerco di esprimere nelle tele o in quant'altro riesca ad utilizzare o riciclare quello che i miei occhi vedono nella realtà che ci circonda e non solo "en plen air" ma anche isolato nelle mie emozioni che questa suscita o credo che susciti nell'uomo nei momenti di solitudine e riflessione

Non ambisco a riportare nei miei dipinti quello che potrebbe essere contraddistinto come simile ad una fotografia ma cerco con tutte le mie forze di distanziarmi dalla pittura realistica perché come spiegavo prima ho desiderio di andare oltre a quello che può sembrare o apparire cercando nei limiti del mio possibile di dare vita alle emozioni

Una delle mie mostre più importanti la intitolai appunto "ARTE COME FORMA DI SUGGESTIONE"

Stilisticamente mi ritengo piuttosto poliedrico non avendo tecnica scolastica e non avendo soprattutto un indirizzo ben preciso

E di questo sono ben felice in quanto la realtà che mi circonda la ritengo appunto in continua evoluzione e assai mutevole

Anche per questo aspetto della realtà rinnovo il mio impegno nel cercare di esprimere e dare vita ai sentimenti più reconditi

Arte oltre che suggestione è per me "Pathos"

"Pathos" nel vero significato etimologico della parola intesa come Passione ma anche come Dolore  
Da quest'ultimo, che ognuno di noi ha dovuto o prima o dopo affrontare almeno una volta, nascono ferite a volte molto profonde ma proprio da queste filtra sempre una luce anche flebile che ti permette di ricrearti e rigenerarti vedendo magari cose che prima non avresti mai notato

E per me la Luce si è sempre espressa attraverso la pittura ma anche attraverso la musica che ritengo essere un altro fenomeno espressivo fondamentale

Il mio stile di pittura lo ritengo spesso molto fisico e gestuale perché spesso derivante da un utilizzo del pennello (ma anche di altri strumenti in quanto amo come per le tele, riciclare qualsiasi oggetto della realtà si presenti al mio cospetto) irruento e molto emotivo

Tema del riciclo e del riutilizzo di cartoni, legni, tele o quant'altro altrimenti sarebbe stato rottamato è per me un fattore di prioritaria importanza in linea soprattutto con un pensiero di rispetto nei confronti della natura e di disprezzo della cultura del consumismo

Ecco così che in questo contesto si unisce all'arte un atteggiamento di sensibilità e impegno "sociale" anche se ne parlo con profonda umiltà

L'arte la ritengo infatti oltre che come sublimazione della mia personalità colta in tutte le sue contraddizioni e profonde emozioni, anche come veicolo fondamentale di riflessione tra l'uomo e la realtà circostante

Vanto alcune mostre nella mia provincia di nascita, una esposizione a Miami, una pagina Instagram e diverse vendite di mie opere sia su commissione che no.

I was born in Pistoia on 10 December 1973

I have been married to Gianna since 2002 and have been the father of a daughter called Bianca since 2003

I live in a place near Pistoia called CIREGLIO, a town in an area between Abetone and Pistoia and therefore where the mountains are starting to come alive

In fact, I love retreating away from the city without naturally escaping it

My school career ended in 1999 with a degree in LITERATURE AND PHILOSOPHY from the University of FLORENCE

However, what has always distinguished me is a deep and intimate passion for art

In addition to painting, I have also been a bass player since the age of 16 and currently play in two bands

However, I consider painting as my personal, most intimate means of expression through which I am able exclusively and truly to express my most intimate and even hidden controversies and anxieties.

I consider it part of me and I try to express on canvases or in anything else I can use or recycle what my eyes see in the reality that surrounds us and not only "en plein air" but also isolated in my emotions that this arouses or I believe it arouses in man in moments of solitude and reflection

I do not aim to bring back into my paintings what could be characterized as similar to a photograph but I try with all my might to distance myself from realistic painting because as I explained before I desire to go beyond what may seem or appear by searching within the limits of my possible to give life to emotions

I titled one of my most important exhibitions "ART AS A FORM OF SUGGESTION"

Stylistically I consider myself rather multifaceted, having no scholastic technique and, above all, not having a very specific direction

And I am very happy about this because I consider the reality that surrounds me to be constantly evolving and very changeable

Also for this aspect of reality I renew my commitment to trying to express and give life to the most hidden feelings

Art as well as suggestion is for me "Pathos"

"Pathos" in the true etymological meaning of the word understood as Passion but also as Pain

From the latter, which each of us has had to face at least once before or after, sometimes very deep wounds arise but from these, even a faint light always filters through which allows you to recreate and regenerate yourself, perhaps seeing things that you wouldn't have before. never noticed

And for me Light has always expressed itself through painting but also through music which I believe to be another fundamental expressive phenomenon

often consider my style of painting to be very physical and gestural because it often derives from the use of the brush (but also of other tools as I love, as with canvases, recycling any object of reality that comes before me), impetuous and very emotional.

The theme of recycling and reuse of cardboard, wood, canvas or anything else that would otherwise have been scrapped is for me a factor of primary importance in line above all with a thought of respect for nature and contempt for the culture of consumerism

This is how in this context a attitude of sensitivity and "social" commitment even if I speak about it with profound humility

In fact, I consider art not only as a sublimation of my personality captured in all its contradictions and profound emotions, but also as a fundamental vehicle of reflection between man and the surrounding reality

I boast some exhibitions in my province of birth, an exhibition in Miami, an Instagram page and several sales of my works both commissioned and not.

Was born in Modena where he still lives and works; the city and places of origin are the landscapes often "photographed" in his works.

Already in adolescence, that artistic talent emerges which - albeit without an adequate path academic – has always been part of his existence with alternating periods of dedication and other long moments of silence.


The profound and painful experiences finally urged the artist to give himself completely to what is its original urgency and that is the vital expression of emotions and impressions produced by events, landscapes, places, people.

The attention of art lovers and collectors for the freshness and immediacy of the art is notable his pictorial eloquence based on pure chromatic sensations; his works are featured in numerous private and public collections.

He has several personal exhibitions behind him, especially in the provincial and regional areas, as well as some presences in national group shows. However, only in recent years has it resumed its exhibition activity with renewed intensity participating in selected events organized by galleries and curators.

The last presence of primary importance, the invitation to the Venice Biennale 2022 – Pavilion Grenada, experienced as recognition of a talent that until now had been practiced in secret as well stimulus towards full and free expressiveness, free from hindrances and reluctance.

In 2023 the invitation to the Triennial Exhibition of Visual Arts in Rome

Then she visited the „painting- and drawingschool Alois Huber“ für one year. Simultaneous she took modeling-lessons from the german sculptor Rudolf Wachter. In autumn she started her professional training as a wood sculptor in the Munich school for construction, art and design „BBZ“ (director: architect and caricaturist E.M. Lang).

Since the final exam till she is working up as a self-employed sculptor (works in wood, plaster, bronze and stone).

she began her training as a puppteer at the „Munich marionett theatre“ and was there employed until then she joined the marionett school of the „Munich Biennale“ (director: composer Hans Werner Henze). In the same time bis she worked up in the „pedagogical action“ with children (building sculptures and puppets with children).

She founded, together with her partner the own „Munich Gallery Theatre“. Till there are realized 23 productions, with more than 1600 performances for adults and children. In her theatre she is responsible for designing and building stage sets, costumes, posters, masks and puppets.

Also for other theatres, of the free theatre scene, she designed stage sets. From till the project „children makes theater“ was realized (building puppets with children). Since she intensively practises painting . Her main-themes are the equality of all cultures. Often these pictures refer critically to present events. Often these are events which she had really seen and watched. Since she leads several sculpting- and painting-workshops.

In her husband died and all activities were sleeping for a long time. She has two daughters and one son. She is member of these art artist associations: „BBK/München OBB“, „Kunstrefugium“, „VBK“



"The Girl and the Crying Fish" is a work of art that eloquently and provocatively addresses the current issue of plastic pollution in the oceans, through the classical iconography of the mermaid. Through its combination of artistic beauty and environmental message, it invites us to consider our role in protecting the oceans and to reflect on the actions necessary to preserve marine life for future generations.



In the last decade I have developed the need for a profound analysis of my work and the desire to overcome the development of the "artifact profile", symbol and icon of "I, anonymous".

There geometric research, aimed at the most marked essentiality, refers to artists such as Kazimir Malevich (with the black square), Josef Albers, the great Mark Rothko (for his colours) and the master Carlo Ciussi, who were a source of inspiration for my studio and they totally soaked me. I think that, in addition to the black square, it is possible to prolong and expand the research, developing other languages on the subject. Playing on the perception and development of the square figure expands the concept of movement, without losing its language of maximum synthesis. The square as a support emerges from the linearity of the load-bearing surface, in a hypothesis of variable movement in its dynamics, developing works

INOGEACTIVE.

My research is based on dynamic volumes (square dynamic, deconstructing of the cube, square cubed, cubist cube, fractionation of a volume, floating volumes, etc...), with the use of various materials ranging from concrete to bronze, to rusted iron to create the effect chromatic range of reds, to wood and regenerated paper with pictorial and sculptural works. Art is an indispensable need for me, that of experiencing it also as a form of play.

# YUNA GALEJEVA

Painter and musicologist, member of the group of painters "Nine Winds".

Born in Siberia (Krasnokamensk) in 1972, now living in Vilnius, Lithuania.

Editor for LRT Klasika, a Lithuanian national radio channel dedicated to culture and classical music; also lectures on History of Opera at the Lithuanian Academy of Music and Theatre.

More than 30 group exhibitions (Lithuania, Italy, Spain, France, Japan, Holland).

For me painting is like composing music on canvas. I like to improvise and strive to make the painting "sound": to make colours and their interrelations as expressive as the chords and tones in music, and the brush strokes and lines a sense of melody and rhythmic pattern. 



His parents also nurtured his passion, which only erupted some time ago with the need to try painting with his own hand. Married and father of two girls, who are also passionate about painting, he lives and works in Ivrea. Whenever a free moment presents itself, he immerses himself in painting, but often these moments are sought between one work commitment and another. It's as if he must reach a canvas at all costs and explosively unleash his feelings physically onto it. He is particularly drawn to the surrealism and abstraction of Mirò and Kandinskij, to Sam Francis, but also to the action painting of Pollock and, before him, Georges Mathieu. He admires Emilio Vedova and dreams of Picasso. He tends to mix the techniques of all these painters, but in his paintings, his unconscious, intuition, improvisation, and instinct always emerge, prevailing when he begins to paint. In fact, his paintings are often different from each other, and in them, there is no distinct and well-defined style because each painting has its own story, emotional memory, and energy. When some resemble each other, it's because the state of mind was the same on both occasions. Rarely are his paintings premeditated and planned beforehand, but they grow under his eyes during the painting process and the overlay of colors. The canvas becomes his energy receptor. Often, the emotional sensation is left to the eyes and the imagination of the viewer, as if his paintings were the product of the observer's deepest fantasies, as if they attempted to draw out the imagination of the viewer and allowed it to flow.







### **Artista digitale per caso.**

Non mi considero un fotografo, forse un artista digitale. Sfrutto la fotografia per i miei ni artistici, Mi piace l'idea di piegare la tecnica alle mie aspirazioni. Non voglio essere dipendente dello strumento ma bensì lo utilizzo per tirare fuori dalla tecnica una sua anima, pittorica appunto.

### **Motivazioni della ricerca "Scatti come dipinti "**

Questa ricerca parte da un premio che ho ottenuto con uno scatto al concorso "Fotografare l'Adda" a Villa Gina nel 2009. Vinsi il primo premio con un'immagine inconsueta in quel contesto di foto naturalistiche. Rimasi sorpreso, non me lo aspettavo.

Così volendo migliorare quel risultato, ripresi a fotografare l'Adda ma era inevitabile che la fotografia mi stesse stretta.

Piano piano, i riflessi del fiume mi fecero capire che uno scatto fotografico poteva apparire come un dipinto.

Fu una rivelazione, i riflessi si esprimevano come dei pittori! Non fu facile però affermarlo con delle foto convincenti. Poi un giorno arrivò lo scatto "Movimento quadrato"; mi sembrava un dipinto. Fu il capostipite che aprì la via a numerosissimi tentativi, quasi tutti sbagliati! Ma ormai la strada era segnata, bastava raccoglierne i pochi frutti migliori e procedere oltre.

### **Fusione tra fotografia e sensibilità artistica.**

Tutte le opere di questa ricerca, che inizia con la serie "Riflessi dell'Adda", sono nate dall'incontro tra la fotografia e la sensibilità artistica che vede dietro ad uno scatto il potenziale pittorico. Le capacità dell'artista permettono di intuire la grande espressività di questa fusione e ne catturano l'immagine portando così allo scoperto le grandi doti artistiche di un'immagine fotografica. Una specie di rivalsa dell'arte sulla tecnica, dove è l'uomo a decidere della tecnologia e non il contrario.

La reflex e la tecnologia digitale servono a catturare un attimo impossibile da riprendere senza il loro contributo, ma è l'artista a decidere quale situazione fermare e come elevarla ad opera d'arte.

### **Fotografo con l'anima del pittore.**

Da questa prima serie seguono altre serie dove l'intento è di imprimere sull'opera anche le doti pittoriche di un artista. Se andate sul sito sul sito ["https://www.tonitraglia.com/miart/OF/scattiDipinti/"](https://www.tonitraglia.com/miart/OF/scattiDipinti/), vedrete che non mi baso più sui riflessi ma su scatti comuni sui quali intervengo cromaticamente con Photoshop. L'obiettivo però è sempre lo stesso, fare esprimere uno scatto come se fosse un dipinto. Non ho fatto uso di filtri, effetti o manipolazioni, ho solo agito sull'interpretazione dei colori. In sostanza, oltre all'occhio del fotografo, ho voluto che si sentisse l'anima del pittore che trasforma la realtà in opera d'arte.

### **Un processo digitale per dipingere come una volta.**

Le serie successive nascono dallo stesso comportamento messo in atto fin dalla ripresa degli scatti fotografici, cioè vedere le foto come se fossero opere artistiche, anzi pittoriche se possibile.

Un'attitudine che segue un processo tutto digitale che gestisco interamente partendo da immagini riprese da una reflex Nikon per proseguire con l'interpretazione artistica con Photoshop e per finire poi in produzione con stampe Inkjet Epson.

Lo scatto originale risulta determinante per l'esito delle interpretazioni, la macchina fotografica deve avere dunque un'occhio da pittore oltre che da fotografo.

I am a professional graphic designer, specialized and award-winning in corporate brand and packaging design. I have had a passion for visual arts since I was a child. I have always drawn, I paint less and less and I shoot whenever I can. In fact, in recent years photography has occupied a lot of space in my artistic work. In particular, I am carrying out research that interprets photographic images as if they were pictorial works.

### **Digital artist by chance.**

I don't consider myself a photographer, maybe a digital artist. I use photography for my artistic purposes. I like the idea of folding it technique to my aspirations. I don't want to be dependent on the tool but rather use it to bring out one technique his soul, pictorial indeed.

### **Reasons for the research "Shots like paintings"**

This research starts from a prize I obtained with a shot in the "Fotografare l'Adda" competition at Villa Gina in 2009. I won the first prize with an unusual image in that context of nature photos. I was surprised, I didn't expect it.

So wanting to improve that result, I resumed photographing the Adda but it was inevitable that photography was too tight for me. Little by little, the reflections of the river made me understand that a photographic shot could appear like a painting.

It was a revelation, the reflections expressed themselves like painters! However, it was not easy to affirm it with convincing photos. Then a

day came the "Square Movement" shot; it looked like a painting to me. He was the founder who paved the way for numerous attempts, almost all wrong! But by now the path was marked, it was enough to collect the few best fruits and proceed further.

### **Fusion between photography and artistic sensitivity.**

All the works of this research, which begins with the "Riflessi dell'Adda" series, were born from the encounter between photography and the artistic sensitivity that sees the pictorial potential behind a shot. The artist's skills allow us to understand the great expressiveness of this fusion and capture the image, thus bringing to light the great artistic qualities of a photographic image. A kind of revenge of art on technology, where man decides on technology and not the other way around.

The reflex and digital technology serve to capture a moment that is impossible to shoot without their contribution, but it is the artist who decides which situation to freeze and how to elevate it to a work of art.

### **Photographer with the soul of a painter.**

From this first series other series follow where the intent is to also impress the pictorial skills of an artist on the work. If you go to the site ["https://www.tonitraglia.com/miart/OF/scattiDipinti/"](https://www.tonitraglia.com/miart/OF/scattiDipinti/), you will see that I no longer rely on reflections but on common shots on which I intervene chromatically with Photoshop. The objective, however, is always the same, to express a shot as if it were a painting. I didn't use filters, effects or manipulations, I just acted on the interpretation of the colors. Basically, beyond the eye of the photographer, I wanted you to feel the soul of the painter who transforms reality into a work of art.

### **A digital process to paint like it used to be.**

The subsequent series arise from the same behavior implemented since the taking of the photographic shots, that is, seeing the photos

as if they were artistic works, or rather pictorial if possible.

An attitude that follows an entirely digital process that I manage entirely starting from images taken by a Nikon reflex to continue with the artistic interpretation with Photoshop and then end up in production with Epson Inkjet prints.

The original shot is crucial for the outcome of the interpretations, the camera must therefore have the eye of a painter as well as a photographer.

The celebration of the territory in which he lives and works becomes the protagonist of his works, of nature in all its manifestations generating a direct and profound interaction with the observer who remains enveloped and captivated so much as to wonder if what he sees is a pictorial painting or a photograph? The importance of the artistic process here identifies a turning point for the artist capable of scrutinizing and representing the essence of the world around us through a completely intimate and personal sensitivity. Looking at one of his works seems to be almost transported into a dreamlike dimension of profound interiority. The art of Toni Traglia gives us moments of sharing, suspended in time and surrounded by a little moment of rare delicacy and refinement. Non mi definisco "pittore"... Faccio "altro"

anima e corpo ma che riesce anche a darti quel  
senso che spesso cerchiamo inutilmente.  
Esprimo stati d'animo, che spesso si modificano  
nell'arco della realizzazione di un quadro e  
a quel punto, nascono i lavori migliori.  
Ecco, qua sono nel mio centro.  
Perché la pittura. Mi ci sono avvicinato con molto  
rispetto, provenendo da studi prettamente  
tecnici e avendo realizzato per anni grafica digitale,  
un approccio quasi naturale al mondo artistico,  
usando i mezzi che utilizzo tutti i giorni per la mia  
professione.

Ma la potenza di lavorare con le mani, sperimentare, fare e disfare, sovrapporre, incollare, sporcare, graffiare, annusare, godere e dispiacersi... tutto questo ho capito fin dal primo tentativo, che poteva arrivare solo in questo modo. La mia pittura può essere definita informale, ma è un informale sicuramente non gestuale; ha bisogno di una preparazione di fondo su cui poi lavorare, stendendo il colore in modo che non sia percepibile la pennellata.

E il meccanismo è lo stesso, sia quando i lavori comportano l'uso di carta e colla mescolata al colore sia quando lavoro in modo più canonico: attraverso numerosi passaggi e sovrapposizioni di materiali e colori, arrivo a quell'equilibrio formale che mi consente di considerare "chiusa" un'opera.

Architect, born in '63, living and working in Florence.  
I don't call myself a "painter" I do "something else"

Something... mainly for me, a form of expressiveness, something tangible, that engages body and soul but that also manages to give you that certain sense that we often look for, in vain.

I express moods and spirits, often they change during works-in-progress and that's when magic happens and the best works are born.

That's where feel centered.

Why do I paint? I approached with great respect, with a background of purely technical studies and years of creating digital graphics.

An almost natural approach to the artistic world, using the tools that I use every day for my job. But the power of working with your hands, experimenting, creating and undoing, layering, strafying, gluing, dirtying, scratching, smelling, enjoying and feeling displeasure... from the very first attempt.

I understood that this could only be achieved in this way.

My works can be defined informal, but certainly they are informal without the "gesturalism" of action painting; I need to prepare the base coat to work on, applying the color so that the brush stroke is not perceptible.

The mechanism is the same, either when the work includes the use of paper and glue mixed with color, either when it's a more canonical way of working: through numerous steps, layering materials and colors, I arrive at that formal balance where I feel that I can consider a painting to be "finished".

L'approfondimento di questa componente e di tutti i suoi strati riflette esattamente ciò che accade nella vita in tutte le sue sfaccettature. L'anima di Miche Berlot è in grado di mettere in luce la psicologia umana attraverso un linguaggio astratto di notevole intensità emotiva e psicologica. Un'indagine approfondita sull'esistenza umana attraverso uno stile in cui i protagonisti sono i materiali, i colori, il processo attraverso cui si porta alla luce il pensiero, un concetto, un istante, l'animo umano.

Her creative process begins in the beautiful landscape that surrounds her studio. She is living in the countryside with the sea nearby. 

The works are developed through drawings of the natural world and a process of experimentation.


Gregson embroideries of imaginative landscapes use applique with recycled fabrics.

# HIROMUNE OTAKE


I was painting oil painting between the ages of 13 and 17, but I became a technician of interior construction and left the painting.
